Outstanding Artists

Tom Chatterton (Wellington)

Tom is frequently in demand as a solo performer, accompanist and conductor with performing engagements that have taken him to some of the most acclaimed venues across New Zealand and the globe. On immigrating with his family to NZ in 2016, he was appointed Director of Music at St Matthew-in-the-City (Auckland) in 2016. Upon moving to Wellington in 2017, Tom has taken on the role of Organist of Sacred Heart Cathedral, and is the Head of Music at Chilton Saint James School in Lower Hutt. Alongside Tom's passion for organ and choral music, he is focused on delivering a meaningful programme of music education and is in the process of founding the Chilton Music School: a specialist music school that equips the most talented young Kiwi musicians with the knowledge, skills and qualifications to succeed as an international professional musician.



Christopher Luke (New Plymouth)

Christopher J. Luke moved from Hobart, Australia, to New Plymouth in January 2012 to take the post of Director of Music to Taranaki Community & Cathedral and Executive Officer to the Music Innovation Trust of Taranaki. This involves being Organist and Director of Music to the Taranaki

Cathedral Church of St Mary, Music Director to Ars Nova Choir, the Great Taranaki Steam Band and recently Music Director to The Devon Hotel New Plymouth Brass. He has directed and played with the Taranaki Symphony Orchestra, directing performances in the Taranaki International Arts Festival in 2013, 2015 and 2017. He has worked with leading opera soloists Bryony Williams, Anna Pierard, Derek Hill, Linden Loader, Roger Wilson and Jonathan Lemalu. Christopher gives monthly lunchtime organ recitals at the cathedral and St Joseph's Catholic Church.
